

HKUST International Summer Exchange Program (ISP) 2015 Information Sheet for Exchange Partners

Program Features

Students can study up to 9 credits of regular UG-level courses offered by HKUST. Local excursions and cultural activities will be arranged exclusively for ISP participants. There will be activities and events for ISP participants to interact with local HKUST students to encourage cultural exchange.

Program Period

The program will take place over HKUST's summer semester, i.e. from **June 22 to August 15, 2015** (accommodation period is from *2pm on June 18 to noon on August 16, 2015*). Courses will start and end on different dates within the summer semester period. The course list is expected to be available in January.

Admissions

Admissions for summer exchange are in general more flexible than the regular semester. However, all summer exchange students must be **nominated by their home institution** and have the English language proficiency sufficient for English-taught university-level courses. Please also note that we may or may not consider students whose majors fall outside of HKUST's major disciplines depending on the School or Office with which your institution has an exchange agreement:

Quota

Although we do not have a specific quota, we encourage you to discuss with us the number of students you plan to send us beforehand and we will try to reserve the space. The number of students you send to us in the summer will not affect the number of students you send in other semesters. As there is an increasing demand for places on ISP, we suggest that you confirm your nominations with us as early as possible.

Exchange Ratio

Exchange partners can send students to our summer program on a **3 to 1 ratio** (i.e. 3 summer quotas would equal to 1 HKUST regular-term quota), or as specified in the exchange agreement. You may feel free to let us know if this arrangement is agreeable to you.





Student Visa

All international students (except holders of Hong Kong Identity Card who has the right to land and study in Hong Kong) are required to obtain a student visa in order to study in Hong Kong. The student visa processing time is normally 6 to 8 weeks. Incomplete applications and missing documents will cause delays; students are strongly advised to follow our instructions carefully when completing their applications. Whether a student is granted a student visa is at the discretion of the Hong Kong Immigration Department. Please note that nationals of Afghanistan, Albania, Cambodia, Cuba, Laos, Korea (Democratic People's Republic of), Nepal and Vietnam are normally not allowed to enter Hong Kong to study. Students who fail to obtain the appropriate document for the right to study in Hong Kong will be declined participation in ISP.

Insurance

All students are required to subscribe to the HKUST Compulsory Travel Insurance Plan. If your students are covered by an institutional insurance policy that covers for their exchange periods, you may wish to contact us about our institutional insurance waivers; waivers may be given on a case-by-case basis.

Accommodation

All ISP participants will be provided on-campus accommodation. Students will be assigned to a double or trip room in a student hall on campus for the program duration.

Program Fees

While students do not need to pay tuition fees to HKUST, each summer exchange student will be charged a program fee:

Basic program fee (includes on-campus accommodation fee, program activities fee, and any administrative fees)	USD 849
Student visa application fee (not applicable to students who do not require a student visa to study in Hong Kong)	USD 58

Application Procedures

As students must be nominated by their home institutions to participate in ISP, we are asking students to apply for the program through the Exchange or International Office of their home institutions:

Summer Student Exchange at HKUST

The HKUST International Summer Exchange Program (ISP) welcomes students from our partner institutions to study at HKUST in the summer. The program aims to create a rewarding exchange experience for students from around the world. It comprises high-quality courses taught by HKUST faculty and opportunities to participate in local excursions that enable you to gain insight into the region.

Courses and credits

A wide range of courses are offered by HKUST's four Schools: Science, Engineering, Business and Management, and Humanities and Social Science; and the Interdisciplinary Programs Office. All courses are taught by the HKUST faculty. Medium of instruction is normally English unless otherwise specified.

ISP participants are required to study at least three and up to nine credits. Courses normally bear three credits unless otherwise specified. You should check with your home institution on credit transfer policies.

Application and fees

ISP accepts applications from students who are nominated by HKUST's exchange partners. Nominated students do not have to pay tuition to HKUST, but you will pay for accommodation costs and a few minor fees. Application deadlines may vary by institution. Interested students, please apply through the Exchange Office of your home institution.
